1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in

1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) "price" means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

 - (a) has been requested to submit a bid in response to this bid invitation;

1. INTRODUCTION

The Ntabankulu Local Municipality embarked on a subdivision project on Portion of Erf 87 into various portions and these include erven 334, 335, 336, 338, and 339. The Ntabankulu Local Municipality intends to extend the validity of the approved subdivision of land to comply with the requirements of the Deeds Registrar.
